DESCRIPTION

The Fine Arts Work Center (FAWC) is partnering with RISD Careers to award scholarships to 2 RISD students or alumni to participate in a one-week, summer, visual arts or creative writing workshop in 2023. RISD students/alumni will pay no tuition and will be provided housing. Awardees must arrange travel to and from Provincetown but can submit travel receipts to FAWC for reimbursement up to a maximum of \$500. Awardees are responsible for the cost of their own materials and for all meals except for breakfast. The FAWC Summer Workshop Program offers over 60 week-long workshops in visual arts and creative writing for more than 500 students over the course of 9 weeks every summer. Nationally recognized artists and writers come to FAWC in Provincetown to teach workshops and to participate in readings and artist talks that are open to the public and enjoyed by hundreds in the community.

FAWC in Provincetown, Massachusetts is a non-profit organization dedicated to encouraging the growth and development of emerging visual artists and writers and to enhancing the year-round vitality of the historic art community of Provincetown. FAWC was founded in 1968 by a group of artists who envisioned a place in Provincetown, the country's most enduring artists' community, where artists and writers could live and work together in the early phase of their careers. FAWC is internationally known for an acclaimed Fellowship program, which grants seven-month residencies to 20 emerging writers and artists every winter. The Fellowships have provided sustained and crucial time and space to over 1,000 emerging artists and writers over the course of FAWC's 50+ year history. FAWC also offers open-enrollment educational programs that provide opportunities to artists of all levels to take strides in their artistic practice and become part of a rich creative community, in addition to helping preserve Provincetown as a cultural destination.

ELIGIBILITY

- This opportunity is available to undergraduate and graduate students graduating December 2022 or June 2023 who will be new alumni during the Summer Workshop. (It is also available to all alumni.)
- Applicants from all disciplines in the visual arts or creative writing will be considered.
- Non-U.S. Citizens are eligible.
- Working knowledge of English is required.

APPLICATION PROCESS & COMPONENTS

- Apply directly to FAWC by their deadline. The application includes a statement of intent, a resume, 3 images (still and/or video), image descriptions, and two references' contact information. The link to the application is found on the RISD Careers Managed Grant page.
- In your application to FAWC note your RISD education.
