Checklist & Deadlines – Applying in 2024

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☐ Get Started Between February and April

- Attend the RISD Fulbright Information Session.
- Review Fulbright country program summaries and requirements. https://us.fulbrightonline.org/countries
- Review the Fulbright U.S. Student Program website, especially About/Eligibility;
 About/Competition & Selection; Applicants/Application Components.

- Review carefully this RISD Fulbright Checklists & Deadlines document and the RISD Getting

- Review the RISD Fulbright Alumni website to learn about the impact the Fulbright has had on RISD Fulbrighters' career and lives. <u>www.risdfulbright.com</u>
- Develop organizational tools based on your style set personal goals/timeline, create a plan and a to-do list, and be ready to capture your ideas in writing.

☐ Initial Meeting(s) with RISD Career Advisors

 Meet with RISD Career Advisors to review the Fulbright process, gain advice and insights, and brainstorm ideas. https://careercenter.risd.edu/meet-us Between February and April

□ Project Development

- Conduct in-depth project, country, and affiliate research. Start by February
- Consult with professors in your department and/or in other disciplines related to your project. Having a professor or expert in your field guide your project development early in the process will greatly strengthen your proposal. Before summer break
- Access Fleet Library's collections at RISD and email or meet with a Research Librarian to expand on your findings, identify critical sources, and/or build research skills.
- o Meet with the RISD Center for Arts & Language to brainstorm and outline project ideas.
- Reach out to RISD Fulbright Alumni in your discipline or of your country choice.

☐ Kick-start Meeting / Intent to apply

- Meet with the RISD Fulbright Program Advisor (FPA) to confirm your intent to apply and discuss the viability of your proposal and the process. By 5/23/24
 At this meeting you should be prepared to talk in-depth about your proposal and address the following questions:
 - --What country are you applying to AND why? What is unique about this country to advance your line of inquiry?
 - --Are there specific country requirements/preferences and how do you intend to address them? (language, affiliation, fields of study, project type) Review and reference the country page: https://us.fulbrightonline.org/countries
 - --What are your project ideas/grant activities ideas? What is your unique, narrowed-in angle that will make you stand out and make a case for feasibility?
 - --Are you applying in the creative arts or academics? If arts, how are your activities, learning, engagement, lens, and outcomes a creative arts project versus focused on academic research or study?
 - --What are your affiliate ideas and nature of relationship/support needed and/or graduate program of study AND why?
 - --Why you? How are you prepared and what is the artistic area of growth?

☐ Host Country Affiliation

- o Research and determine potential affiliates. Between February and April
- Meet with RISD Global to determine any RISD connections in your country choice and possible affiliate options. Between March and May
- Reach out to the host country Fulbright Commission to ask for assistance with your affiliate development and/or specific questions. As needed
- Begin outreach to potential affiliates. You may have to pick up the phone! By the end of May
- o Develop affiliation relationship. By the end of June
- o Confirm affiliate and check on status of affiliate letter. By the end of July
- Receive affiliate letter on official letterhead signed by author (with English translation if applicable). By early to mid-August
- Upload affiliate letter into the online application for application LOCK RISD reviews and interview. If the affiliation is not secured at this point, RISD may determine to not conduct the interview.
 By 8/18/24

☐ Statement of Grant Purpose – 2 Pages

- Make progress on your narrative structure bullets, an outline, or rough draft. Getting your thoughts in writing will help you move things along. By mid-May
- Email 1st Draft Statement to the FPA. You can use the "Key Content" (see RISD Fulbright Getting Started) as headers for this 1st Draft and respond to each. However, this draft should be in narrative form, not bullets. This draft should identify the country and why, and include a defined project and possible affiliates

 By 6/5/24
- Meet with the RISD Center for Arts & Language to discuss your drafts and revisions.
 Between June and early August
- o Meet with your professor or mentor to discuss your drafts. Between June and early August
- Email Developed Draft Statement to the FPA, which should be in the 2 page narrative format.
 The Developed Draft should address all the "Important Fulbright Points" (see RISD Fulbright Getting Started). This draft should include affiliate details, and have a clearly defined research topic, compelling reasons for choosing a particular country, a straightforward project plan, and distinct expected results/outcomes. Between July and early August
- Upload your Statement into the Fulbright online application for the application LOCK RISD reviews and interview.
 By 8/18/24
- Fine-tune your Statement after your RISD Fulbright Interview. September
- Upload your Final Statement. By 10/2/24 The national deadline is 10/8/24.

□ Personal Statement – 1 Page

- Make progress on your narrative structure bullets, an outline, or rough draft. Getting your thoughts in writing will help you move things along. By mid-May
- Email 1st Draft Statement to the FPA with your Statement of Grant Purpose. By 6/5/24
- Meet with the RISD the RISD Center for Arts & Language to discuss your drafts and revisions.
 Between June and August
- Email Developed Draft Statement to the FPA, which should be in the 1 page format. Between July and early August
- Upload your Statement into the Fulbright online application for the application LOCK RISD reviews and interview. By 8/18/24
- o Fine-tune Statement after your RISD Fulbright Interview. September
- Upload your Final Statement. By 10/2/24 The national deadline is 10/8/24.

□ Portfolio

- Review Portfolio requirements for your chosen discipline and the uploading process.
 By the end of June
- o Review the Portfolio narrative questions and character counts. By the end of June
- Determine and prepare images and narrative responses. Between June and early August
- Upload images and narrative into the Fulbright online application for the application LOCK RISD reviews and interview. By 8/18/24
- Fine-tune your materials. September
- Upload your final images and narratives. By 10/2/24 The national deadline is 10/8/24.

☐ Online Application - Biographical Data and Essays

- Register an account by going to the Applicants tab at https://us.fulbrightonline.org. Go to Applicants tab, Fulbright Online Application. By the end of May
- o Review online biographical data that will be needed and essay questions. By the end of June
- o Collect information and prepare the online application. Between June and early August
- Develop compelling essays that align with purpose statement in content AND quality.
 Between June and early August
- LOCK your application to receive a RISD full application package review, a RISD portfolio review, and a RISD Fulbright Interview. By 8/18/24
- Fine-tune answers and short essays. September
- Complete and SUBMIT your final application to Fulbright. By 10/2/24 The national deadline is 10/8/24.

□ Special Requirements for Country

- Determine if there are any additional requirements of the country (translations, statements in the host country language, admission letters, communication with officials, etc.) By the end of June
- Determine if your country offers the Critical Language Enhancement Award (CLEA), and if you
 are eligible and interested. Complete the CLEA form and address this in your plans in the
 Statement of Grant Purpose. By the end of July
- Complete and upload any additional documents for the application LOCK RISD reviews and interview. By 8/18/24

□ Transcripts

- Obtain transcripts from the Registrar from each of your post-secondary schools (a student copy rather than official is fine; however, the RISD unofficial transcript will not work as there is not enough detail). In July/early August
- Scan, adjust, and upload your transcript for the application LOCK RISD reviews and interview.
 By 8/18/24

□ Language Self-Evaluation (LSE)

- o Determine if an LSE form is required or recommended by your country. By the end of May
- o Review the requirements and instructions. By the end of July
- Complete the form in the online application for the application LOCK RISD reviews and interview. By 8/18/24

□ Application LOCK for Campus Review ○ LOCK your application to receive a RISD full approximate and RISD lateration.

- LOCK your application to receive a RISD full application package review, a RISD portfolio, review, and RISD Interview. By 8/18/24
- o Do not unlock your application until after the interview.

☐ RISD Fulbright Interview

- Confirm that all materials are complete and uploaded into the online application for review by the RISD Fulbright Interview Committee. LOCK your application. By 8/18/24
- o If the affiliation is not secured or the application incomplete at this point, RISD may determine to not conduct the interview.
- Attend the RISD Fulbright Interview via Zoom; arranged by the FPA. The week of 9/9/24

☐ Foreign Language Evaluation (FLE)

- o Determine if an FLE is required or recommended by your country. By the end of May
- Determine who your evaluator will be (a professional language teacher) and review the requirements and instructions with them. By the end of July
- Complete the evaluation with your evaluator. In August/September
- Register your evaluator in the online application and make sure they understand the uploading process. In August/September
- o Ensure your evaluator has uploaded the form. By 10/2/24 The national deadline is 10/8/24.

☐ Recommendations – 3 Required

- Reach out to recommenders who can speak to your ability to carry out the project.
 By the end of July
- Register your 3 recommenders in the online application and make sure they understand the uploading process. By mid-August
- Ensure ALL 3 recommenders have uploaded their letter. By 10/2/24 The national deadline is 10/8/24.

□ SUBMIT

- Make final, limited, select edits to your application after your interview. This final stage is up to you! Mid-September
- o Proof all the pages of your final application carefully. Late September
- SUBMIT your final application. By 10/2/24 The national deadline is 10/8/24.

□ Award Notification

- The U.S. Fulbright Screening Committee will review applications and notify candidates if they
 are a Semi-Finalist, which means they have been recommended to the host country for
 review. In late January/early February.
- The host countries review applications and make award decisions. Final award notifications will trickle in during the spring semester. Between February and May.
